1. INTRODUCTION

This document summarises the information needed by National Federations for participation in the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships and the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Challenge and Masters. It may be revised from time to time. The version in force is that found on the [UCI website](#). Registration in the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships, Masters or Challenge implies agreement with the UCI Regulations and the Technical Guide.

2. ABOUT THE TRACK

The Brisbane SX International BMX Centre is situated at the Sleeman Sports Complex, Old Cleveland and Tilley Roads, Chandler, Brisbane, just 20 minutes from central Brisbane and the South Bank area. The Sleeman Sports Complex includes a number of training and competition venues for differing sports, with the BMX Racing track and the Anna Meares Velodrome situated together on the south side of the complex.

The track layout is a standard form of BMX Racing track with 4 straights, the second and third straights include an 'Elite straight' for the male championships categories. The first corner turns to the right and has been rebuilt to cater for the advanced racing that is synonymous with the UCI BMX Racing World Championships. The track was completely rebuilt in 2023 by Bike Tracks Australia, with additional works completed on the first corner following the successful 2024 UCI BMX Racing World Cup held at this venue. A new surface to be applied in autumn of 2026, ready for the UCI BMX Racing World Championships in July. All corners are sealed with asphalt and provide for fast cornering while maintaining the riders speed from the straights.

3. RULES AND REGULATIONS

3.1 PARTICIPATION

3.1.1 UCI BMX RACING WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

9.1.018 Each National Federation shall participate in World Championships in a spirit of friendship and fair play and contribute to the utmost to the success of the Championships.

9.1.019 Each National Federation participating in the World Championships shall, register with the UCI, within the deadlines specified by the latter, all riders and other persons that will be on or will accompany its delegation (officials, attendants, guests, etc.).

9.1.022 In general each National Federation shall co-operate with the organiser and, to the extent possible, facilitate his work.

9.2.001 It is the National Federations who select riders to participate in World Championships. Riders classified as “refugee” pursuant to article 1.1.033 shall register directly with the UCI. The UCI may authorise riders classified as “refugee” in addition to the quotas provided for in the UCI Regulations and qualification regulations, without prejudice to specific eligibility requirements that may be determined.

9.2.003 National Federations shall enter with the UCI via its website. National Federations which do not have Internet access may enter using the entry forms provided by the UCI

9.2.004 The enrolment of the federations’ riders shall reach the UCI at the latest within the following deadline:

Online Rider Registration closing details:

Challenge and Masters Categories: **30 June 2026, 12:00 CEST**

Championships Categories: **06 July 2026, 12:00 CEST**

9.2.005 Save in the case of an act of God, a National Federation that has enrolled by returning the enrolment form for a World Championship and that does not participate shall be liable to a fine of CHF 500 to CHF 2,000.

9.2.006 National Federations may substitute up to a maximum of two riders entered for each of the World Champion title competitions provided that it communicates the name of the two substitutes in writing to the UCI at the latest the third day before the beginning of the competition in question.

9.2.007 Federations shall announce the names of the riders who are to take the start to the Commissaires Panel by noon at the latest on the eve of the first race of the competition.

Rider Confirmation Times:

Championships categories: **16 July 2026, from 11:00 to 12:30**

Challenge and Masters categories: **16 July 2026, from 14:00 to 16:00**

9.2.008 Unless prevented by an act of God, a rider once announced as taking the start and who fails to present, shall be liable to a fine of CHF 500 to CHF 5,000. An injury or sickness shall be recognised as an act of God only if the rider is declared incapable of taking the start by the UCI official doctor.

9.2.009 In all individual specialities, the outgoing World Champion may take part in addition to the number of starters that the National Federation of such Champions may enter under the qualification regulations. The same principle is applicable for the Olympic/Paralympic Champion on the occasion of the first World Championships following Olympic/Paralympic Games or, for the mountain bike, the next two mountain bike World Championships. For the Continental Champion, this facility is limited to the first World Championships following the awarding of the title of Continental Champion.

3.1.2 UCI BMX RACING WORLD CHALLENGE

6.4.002 The Challenge event should be organised together with the UCI BMX World Championships, which are regulated in part 9 of the UCI regulations.

6.4.005 bis

The Challenge and Masters level categories held during the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge shall be those defined in articles 6.1.009 to 6.1.011. However, the following exceptions shall apply.

The minimum age eligible to enter the event shall be age 8, as of 31st December of the year in question. For avoidance of doubt, beginning in 2021, the youngest challenge categories offered during the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge shall be as follows:

- 20-Inch Bicycles
 - Boys, age 8
 - Girls, age 8
- Cruisers
 - Boys, ages 12 and under
 - Girls, ages 12 and under

(article modified on 01.01.22; 01.01.25)

6.4.006 Pre-registration for the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge is subject to the following restrictions:

- a. Each national federation shall be permitted to register up to 16 riders in each Challenge level category which is scheduled for competition. The host organisation may register a greater number of riders in each limited category, with a maximum of 32 riders.
- b. Each national federation shall be permitted to register up to 16 riders in each Masters category.
- c. The limits specified in 'a' and 'b' above exclude the riders ranked from 1 to 8 at the previous edition of the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge or Masters event. These riders can be added on top of the riders selected according to the above criteria.

Any errors made during the registration process by a national federation, may be corrected at latest up until the moment of rider's confirmation. However, a fine of CHF 100 payable by the national federation may apply for each correction that is made. No Late Entries are accepted

(article modified on 01.01.21; 01.01.25)

6.1.011 Riders licensed in the Masters category level for Standard 20 Inch bicycles are allowed to participate in the Cruiser 24-inch category corresponding to their age.

3.2 RACE FORMAT

CHAMPIONSHIPS CATEGORIES

9.2.047 ter.

Seeding order for the Round 1 in the BMX race is based on the latest UCI Individual BMX Ranking for each category (seeding order from highest to lowest ranked). Gate position selection order for Round 1 is based on the seeding order.

Important Note: The UCI reserves the right to change the championships race format should unforeseen circumstances require it (example: severe weather). Should this happen, an official communique describing any changes will be sent to all team managers.

CHALLENGE AND MASTERS CATEGORIES

6.4.010 Competition categories shall be as described in articles 6.1.009 to 6.1.011. In order to give the best chance of completing each day of the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge within a reasonable period of time, the UCI reserves the right to change the number of Rounds of Motos that will be held for some, or all of the Challenge and Masters categories should it decide that conditions (weather, large number of entries, or other) require it.

The UCI BMX Racing World Challenge for each Challenge or Masters level category shall take place on the day it is scheduled and shall not be rescheduled. Once competition has begun on any given competition day, in case of cancellation prior to the Final, the results will be determined on the basis of the racing completed for each category in question in accordance with article 6.1.041. For any categories in which at least one round of racing has not been completed, such cancellation shall mean that no results are declared for those categories.

6.4.010 bis

Challenge and Masters riders will be seeded into the motos during the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge using a scrambled system as described in 6.1.027 quarter

Important Note: The UCI reserves the right to change the challenge or masters race format, should unforeseen circumstances require it (example: severe weather). Should this happen, an official communique will be sent to all team managers.

Also, in case a very high number of challenge entries are received, the UCI may decide to change the race format from 3 rounds of Motos to either 2 rounds of Motos or 1 round of Motos before the event begins. If done, this will be decided following the closure of registration once the number of entries is known. If a change is made, it will be announced during the challenge and masters team managers' meeting.

3.3 OTHER REGULATIONS

6.1.002 For participation in BMX Racing events registered on the UCI International BMX Racing Calendar, Riders' categories are determined by the age of those competing as defined by the difference between the year of the event and the year of birth of the rider. Riders categories vary depending on the bicycle types defined in article 6.1.003, levels of categories as defined in article 6.1.004 as well as competition specialities as defined in article 6.1.007. A rider must be at least 5 years of age to compete in a UCI sanctioned BMX Racing event. The minimum age of 5 refers to the real calendar age on the day of BMX Racing event commencement (date of the first practice session).

As concerns the minimum age described above, the categories held during the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge are defined in article 6.4.005bis. Otherwise, the categories defined in articles 6.1.009 to 6.1.011 apply.

3.4 COMBINATION RULES

CHAMPIONSHIPS & MASTERS CATEGORIES

6.1.012 (N) In order for a category to be held, at least five riders must be registered and confirmed in that category following riders confirmation. If less than five riders are entered in a category following riders confirmation, they will be combined with an older category. However, categories with a maximum age of more than 29 shall be combined with the next younger category.

Categories for Standard 20 inch bicycles cannot be combined with Categories for Cruiser 24 inch categories, and vice versa. Championships categories cannot be combined with Challenge

In the case that any under-subscribed category cannot be combined according to these rules, this category shall not be run.

If the adequate numbers of five riders are registered and confirmed during the riders confirmation, the category will be run even if less riders show up at the start, regardless of the reason, including injury or illness.

CHALLENGE CATEGORIES

6.4.005 ter

In order for a category to be held, at least 20 riders must be registered for the Challenge ter category as defined in articles 6.1.009 and 6.1.011. If less than 20 riders are entered in a category following the riders registration, they will be combined with an older category. However, categories with a maximum age of more than 29, shall be combined with the next younger category. Categories for Standard 20 inch bicycles cannot be combined with categories for Cruiser 24 inch categories, and vice versa. In the case that any under subscribed category cannot be combined according to these rules, this category shall not be run. If the minimum number of 20 riders are registered during the rider registration period, the category will be run even if less riders are confirmed at the rider confirmation.

(article introduced on 01.01.26)

3.5 COMBINATION CATEGORIES AND RESULTS

CHAMPIONSHIPS & MASTERS CATEGORIES

6.1.014 In any case where two or more categories are combined, the results of the combined categories must be split back into the original, separate categories based on the results summary for the combined categories.

The UCI will only award points in the UCI BMX ranking based upon the separated results.

Also, the riders are awarded the prize money that corresponds with their place in the separated results.

Example: Class 1 event combination Women Elite and Women Juniors

Result of the Event	Category of rider	Women Juniors	Women Elite

6.1.015 Except as provided by the combination rules in articles 6.1.012 and 6.1.013, no rider is permitted to compete outside of his age or gender group during UCI registered events.

3.6 FINAL CLASSIFICATION

6.1.041 The Final Classification of the BMX Racing competition for each category (or combined category) is determined by:

- a. The Phase reached (Final, Qualifiers, or Motos or, in the specific case of a UCI BMX Racing World Cup with 17 or more entries in the category in question, Round 1 or Last Chance, whichever the case may be).
- b. If the Phase reached is the Final or the Qualifiers, the rank from the last completed Round within that Phase.
- c. If the Phase reached is the Motos, the total points from this Phase. In case the Motos are not completed, then the total points from all Rounds of the Motos that were completed. In the case of a UCI BMX Racing World Cup event, in case the Last Chance phase is not completed, then those in the Last Chance Phase must be ranked below those who advanced directly to the First Round of the Qualifiers.
- d. In the case of a UCI BMX Racing World Cup:
 - i. If the Phase reached is Round 1, then the finish position from Round 1
 - ii. If the Phase reached is Last Chance, then the riders advancing directly to the Qualifiers from Round 1 will be ranked above the riders participating in Last Chance, with the Last Chance riders ranked according to finish position in Last Chance.
- e. The time in the last heat completed, in case of ties the time from the previous heat is considered.

When the tie cannot be broken by time, then the tiebreaker in article 6.1.041 ter shall apply.
(text modified on 01.01.18, 01.01.21; 01.01.22; 01.01.25)

6.1.041 bis (N) In case of a combination of categories, the Final Classification for the combined category is split in accordance with article 6.1.014. A Final Classification for each individual category is then prepared.

CHALLENGE CATEGORIES

6.4.005 quarter

In the case that Challenge categories are combined, the results will be recorded based on the combined category and will not be split into the category of entry for each rider.

Comment: For the avoidance of doubt, articles 6.4.005 ter and 6.4.005 quarter do not apply to the Championships and Masters Categories.

(article introduced on 01.01.26)

3.7 TIES

6.1.041ter

This tie-breaking method is used in the following cases:

- a. In case more than 1 rider in a heat is scored with the same IRM as described in articles 6.1.034 and 6.1.035;
- b. In case a tie occurs in any particular heat where a clear decision cannot be determined from the applicable scoring system in the transferring positions in the Motos, or the Qualifiers or in the case of a UCI BMX Racing World Cup, Round 1 or Last Chance;
- c. In case a tie occurs when determining the Final Classification, as described in article 6.1.041.

In all of the above cases, the tie will be broken by applying the following methods in the order listed below until the tie is broken. In case a method is either not available or not applicable to the situation, then the next highest priority tie-breaking method will be used.

- a. Time in the previous heat
- b. Position in the previous heat
- c. If applicable to the situation, the rider's best finish (time, or if not available, finish position) in the preceding qualifiers preceding in descending order of Semi Final, Quarter Final, Eighth Final, et cetera, until the Motos are reached
- d. In descending order 3rd, 2nd, 1st round finish result in the Motos
- e. BMX Racing Time Trial results (if held)
- f. For Championships categories, the UCI Individual BMX Racing ranking, or for Challenge level and Masters categories, the national ranking or series ranking used for seeding the Motos, if any
- g. In the case of breaking ties between riders scored with the same IRM, at random.

Otherwise, if the tie cannot be broken according to the above method, then the riders concerned shall share the place in question, and the place(s) below would not be allocated. For example: 2 riders tied for 5th place in the semi-finals would both receive 9th place in the Final Classification; the next place awarded would be 11th place.

6.1.041 quarter Should a situation arise in a heat in one of the three Rounds of Motos or Non transferring positions of a heat in the Qualifiers or in the award positions in the Final where a clear decision cannot be determined from the applicable scoring system, both riders will be scored with the better ranked finishing position. For example: a protest between 5th place and 6th place finishing position would in the case of a tied decision ultimately give both riders 5th place finish in that particular heat; 6th place would not be allocated. Award positions in the Final shall refer to the riders ranked 1st to 3rd for the Championships and Masters categories and 1st to 8th for the Challenge categories.

4. SELECTION OF PARTICIPANTS

4.1 CHALLENGE CATEGORIES

6.4.006 Pre-registration for the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge is subject to the following restrictions:

- a. Each national federation shall be permitted to register up to 16 riders in each Challenge level category which is scheduled for competition. The host organisation may register a greater number of riders in each limited category, with a maximum of 32 riders.
- b. Each national federation shall be permitted to register up to 16 riders in each Masters category.
- c. The limits specified in 'a' and 'b' above exclude the riders ranked from 1 to 8 at the previous edition of the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge or Masters event. These riders can be added on top of the riders selected according to the above criteria.

Any errors made during the registration process by a national federation, may be corrected at latest up until the moment of riders confirmation. However, a fine of CHF 100 payable by the national federation may apply for each correction that is made. No Late Entries are accepted

(article modified on 01.01.21; 01.01.25)

4.2 CHAMPIONSHIPS CATEGORIES

9.2.009 In all individual specialities, the outgoing World Champion may take part in addition to the number of starters that the National Federation of such Champions may enter under the qualification regulations.

The same principle is applicable for the Olympic/Paralympic Champion on the occasion of the first World Championships following Olympic/Paralympic Games or, for the mountain bike, the next two mountain bike World Championships.

For the Continental Champion, this facility is limited to the first World Championships following the awarding of the title of Continental Champion. (abridged)

9.2.047 sexes For Men Elite, Women Elite, Men Under 23, Women Under 23, Men Juniors and Women Juniors, the maximum number of riders for each category is determined on the basis of the UCI individual BMX Racing ranking by nation for each such category on 31 December of the preceding season.

Each federation shall be permitted to enter 2 reserves in each category. The UCI Ranking by nations is drawn up in accordance with Part VI "BMX RACING", chapter 6.

In addition to the nations qualified through the UCI BMX Racing nations ranking, the following riders will also be qualified for the Elite world championships:

- Top 8 Men Elite in the UCI BMX Racing individual ranking of 31 December of the preceding season;
- Top 8 Women Elite in the UCI BMX Racing individual ranking of 31 December of the preceding season.

These riders are automatically qualified for the UCI world championships and cannot be replaced by another rider.

5. RIDER CATEGORIES

5.1 CHAMPIONSHIPS AND MASTERS CATEGORIES

9.2.047 The categories for which the title of world champion will be awarded are as follows:

- Men Elite (aged 19 and over);
- Women Elite (aged 19 and over);
- Men Under 23 (19-22) ;
- Women Under 23 (19-22) ;
- Men Junior (aged 17 and 18);
- Women Junior (aged 17 and 18).

B. STANDARD 20 inch BICYCLES (men riders), Masters level:

- Masters Men (aged 30 and over).
- Masters Women (aged 30 and over).

5.2 CHALLENGE CATEGORIES

Categories for Standard 20 Inch bicycles at the Challenge level

6.1.009 (N) Within the competition speciality of BMX Racing defined in article 6.1.007 for the Challenge level, the categories are as follows:

- a. Boys – ages: 5* and 6*, 7*, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16; (11 categories)
- b. Girls – ages: 5* and 6*, 7*, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16; (11 categories)
- c. Men – ages: 17-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35 and over; (4 categories)
- d. Women – ages: 17-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35 and over; (4 categories)

Total: 30 categories.

* These categories are not held at World Challenge events.

Categories for Cruiser 24 Inch bicycles at the Challenge Level

6.1.011 (N) Within the competition speciality of BMX Racing defined in article 6.1.007 for the Challenge level, the categories are as follows:

- a. Girls – ages: 12 and under, 13 and 14, 15 and 16; (3 categories)
- b. Boys – ages: 12 and under, 13 and 14, 15 and 16; (3 categories)
- c. Men – ages: 17-24, 25-29, 30 - 34, 35 - 39, 40 - 44, 45-49, 50 and over; (7 categories).
- d. Women – ages: 17-24, 25-29, 30 - 34, 35 - 39, 40 - 44, 45-49, 50 and over; (7 categories).

Total: 20 categories.

6. RIDER LICENCING AND INSURANCE

National Federations must check all entries in the championships, challenge and masters categories before submitting them to the on-line system. It is the responsibility of each national federation to ensure the accuracy of their list of entries.

6.1 LICENCES AND INSURANCE

National federations are reminded of the requirement to ensure that all participants (applies to Challenge, Masters and Championships riders), regardless of their category must have an international license valid for the season.

Likewise, all riders (applies to Challenge, Masters and Championships riders) must have sufficient insurance to cover them while attending and participating in the championships, in accordance with the UCI Regulations, article 1.1.006.

1.1.006 Federations shall issue licences according to such criteria as they may determine. They shall be responsible for monitoring compliance with these criteria.

Before the licence is issued, the applicant and the national federation must ensure inter alia that the applicant is adequately insured against accidents and civil responsibility in every country where they intend to take part in cycling events or train throughout the year for which the licence is issued.

Once the licence is issued, the licence holder and their team shall be entirely responsible for ensuring that the rider concerned only enters cycling events in countries where the insurance against accidents and for third-party liability are valid. The national federation and the UCI shall not be liable in any manner whatsoever in case a licence holder takes part in a cycling event in a country where their accident insurance or third-party liability insurance are not valid. The licence holder and their team shall be solely and exclusively liable for any such participation in a cycling event.

We thank you for taking all necessary steps to ensure that these requirements are fulfilled and that participants registered by your federation are adequately covered by insurance (against accident, including but not limited to, repatriation, medical costs, et cetera) before arrival at the venue.

6.2 ENTRY ERRORS AND OMISSIONS

Challenge and Masters Categories:

- **Errors:** As defined in article 6.4.006 any errors (including forgotten entries) may be corrected at latest up until the moment of rider confirmation. However, the UCI will apply a fine of CHF 100 for each correction of a registration error that is made. Any such fine must be paid by the federation concerned.
- **Confirmation of Entries:** As defined in article 6.4.005, during riders confirmation, the team manager for each national federation must submit any final errors for correction, and then confirm that all entries for their country are correct; any further errors brought to the UCI's attention following this will not be corrected.
- **Obligation to have a licence:** As defined in article 6.4.005, all riders entered in the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge must have a licence valid for the season issued by the national federation of their country of residence, in accordance with articles 1.1.001 to 1.1.039. The national federation of each such riders' nationality has the duty to confirm this prior to registering that rider for the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge.

6.3 LICENCING REQUIREMENTS

6.4.008: Without prejudice to article 6.1.005, only riders who were licensed in either a Challenge category or Masters category (whichever is applicable) at the start of the present season are permitted to be entered in the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge. These entries can be made only by the national federation recognised by the UCI in the country of their nationality. Each such national federation has sole responsibility for confirming the eligibility of all riders for the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge in accordance with the UCI Regulations, and for ensuring that the riders concerned have the appropriate international license and insurance as required by Part I of the UCI Regulations.

Contravention of this regulation may render any national federation concerned liable to a fine of up to CHF 5'000, in addition to the disqualification of the riders concerned.

6.1.005 A rider aged 17 years or over may choose to compete at either Championships, Challenge or Masters (only if aged 30 and over) level at the beginning of the season, in the appropriate age and gender group.

A rider cannot participate in more than one of the Championships, Challenge, or Masters levels during the same season. The rider's license must indicate the category of the rider; riders may only be registered in the categories indicated on their license.

6.4.005 For avoidance of doubt, all riders entered in the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge must have a license issued by the national federation of their country of residence, in accordance with articles 1.1.001 to 1.1.039. The national federation of each such rider's nationality has the duty to confirm this prior to registering that rider for the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge event. "Article Abridged"

7. CHALLENGE AND MASTERS – TRANSPONDER USE

7.1 TRANSPONDER ALLOCATION

Riders are requested to bring their own transponder to the event, which must have a current subscription and a good battery level remaining. A different transponder must be used for each bike type, 20" and/or Cruiser. There is no requirement to provide the transponder details as the transponder will be picked up during the practice days as the riders enter the team area.

7.2 TRANSPONDER SPARES

For National Federations, where riders are bringing their own transponders, it is strongly recommended that Team Managers bring several spare transponders in case of subscription, battery or other problems that may occur with the riders transponders.

7.3 TRANSPONDER RENTAL

It is possible to rent a transponder from the Timing company for riders who do not have their own transponder. A deposit is required to be paid in cash (AUD) on picking up transponders, this is refundable upon the return of all rental transponders at the completion of the day's event.

Rental transponders will be distributed to the Team Managers at the Rider Confirmation.

All rental transponders must be returned to the Timing Company after racing has completed and at the latest 1 hour after the finish of racing on 25 July 2026.

NOTE: Team Managers are responsible for the return of the rental transponders. National Federations will be sent an invoice for AUD \$100 for every transponder not returned.

7.4 TRANSPONDER CHECKING

A multi-lane checking point will be set up on the entry to the Team Area. All riders must pass this point and wheel their bike across the mats. The rider details and category will show on the monitor. If the rider details do not show up, or are incorrect, it is the riders' responsibility to escalate this to the Timing Company for rectification.

Team Staff should accompany riders through this checking process as it is the rider's responsibility to confirm the details are correct.

Bikes will not be allowed in the venue if they do not have a working transponder attached.

7.5 TRANSPONDER DURING COMPETITION

It is the rider's responsibility to ensure a working transponder is fitted to their bicycle for each race and that the transponder is linked to the rider.

Failure to have the correct working transponder attached to the rider's bicycle will result in the rider being scored DNF.

6.1.039.b. If the rider's transponder falls off or malfunctions during a race the photo finish record shall be used to confirm the result.

8. RIDER REGISTRATION

All riders competing at the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships, Challenge and Masters must have a current 2026 UCI ID before registration for the event.

The name and contact information of the challenge team manager and the name and contact information of the championships team manager (e-mail + mobile phone number) for each national federation must also be given during the registration process.

Failure to provide these details will mean that no information concerning communiques, schedule updates et cetera will be received.

8.6 ENTRY FEE PAYMENTS

8.8 RIDER PACKS

CHAMPIONSHIPS CATEGORIES

The Team Manager for each nation will receive the rider packs for each rider that has been confirmed to take the start.

Within each pack there will be a front number plate, a lateral plate, cable ties an accreditation badge and lanyard.

Championship riders must wear the accreditation badge to enter and exit the team area (except for entering the staging and track for practice or racing). Failure to wear the badge will mean the rider is not able to access the accredited area, including the team area.

The Championship riders will not be issued with bike stickers, it is the responsibility of the riders and the Team Managers/staff to ensure proper security of the riders' equipment, including the bicycles during the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships.

There will be no bike security on the Team Area, National Federations are asked to limit the bicycles that are brought to the team area to be 1 race bike and 1 spare bike for each rider and 1 bike per team staff member.

CHALLENGE & MASTERS CATEGORIES

The Team Manager for each nation will receive the rider packs for each rider that has been confirmed to take the start. Within each pack there will be a front number plate, a lateral plate, cable ties, a wristband and a matching sticker to put on their bike.

It is important that the sticker is applied correctly (as in the photo below) so that the bike can be scanned on entry and exit of the Team area. The sticker must not be curved on the frame.



In case of a damaged wristband, the wristband and sticker can be replaced at the Team Area access point.



9. ACCREDITATION DELEGATION

9.1 ONLINE ACCREDITATION REQUESTS

Please note that each National Federation taking part in the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships, Challenge and Masters must register all persons included in the delegation with the UCI, using the online system.

9.3 RIDERS – CHAMPIONSHIPS, CHALLENGE AND MASTERS

CHAMPIONSHIPS CATEGORIES

All riders will be automatically accredited upon acceptance of their entry. Riders will be issued an accreditation badge once confirmed at the Rider Confirmation, that will be their accreditation pass to the Team and Spectator areas. Accreditation does not give access to the Grandstand.

CHALLENGE & MASTERS CATEGORIES

All riders will be automatically accredited upon acceptance of their entry. Riders will be issued a wristband once confirmed at the Rider Confirmation, that will be their accreditation pass to the Team and Spectator areas. Accreditation does not give access to the Grandstand.

9.4 TEAM STAFF – CHALLENGE AND MASTERS

6.4.009 Each member organization which registers riders must appoint a national team manager to represent the interests of all of its riders at the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge. In addition to this Challenge team manager, between 2 and 20 team assistants for each team are allowed; the number of team assistants allowed shall be determined based upon the number of challenge entries registered for each such country, as described in the Technical Guide for the event. All team staff must be accredited in accordance with the competition guide. Such accreditation may be revoked for any breach of the UCI regulations or non-compliance with the instructions of the organisation or commissaires' panel.

Only people who are legally considered to be adults in the country in which the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge is held as of the date of commencement of the Event may be accredited as team staff. In case of any doubt regarding this, then the minimum age shall be 18 as of the date of commencement of the UCI BMX Racing World Challenge.

If a different jersey is used for Championships, than the jersey used for Challenge and Masters riders, then images of both jerseys must be submitted.

11. TEAM MANAGER BADGES - CHALLENGE

11.1 TM BADGE ALLOCATION

Challenge and Masters Team Managers will be issued with two (2) badges which contain the National Federation name and national flag, plus the large letters of TM. These badges are NOT accreditation badges; all team staff must wear their full accreditation badge with their name and photo printed on the front side.

The TM badge allows access to the Team Manager zone near the finish area and to the Team Managers area. These badges may be shared within the team staff to provide access to the areas needed by the team staff.

For the avoidance of doubt, the TM badge is for Challenge and Masters only and does not provide access to the track infield or the start gate.



12. TEAM MANAGER BIBS - CHAMPIONSHIP

12.1 ALLOCATION AND DEPOSIT

Team Managers bibs only apply for the Championships category Team Managers.

Team bibs will be issued on a ratio of one (1) Team bib per eight (8) riders during the Rider Confirmation. A deposit of €100.00 is payable per Team bib issued.

The Team bib allows the wearer access to the locations described during the Championships Team Managers' Meeting.

Team bibs must be returned before the main finals on [Sunday 19 July 2026](#).

13. TEAM AREA AND TEAM TENT BOOKINGS

13.1 TEAM AREA – CHALLENGE

Each country will have a dedicated team area; 4 Chairs and 1 table are provided for every 20 entries. Countries with smaller numbers of entries may be grouped together. The position and size will be determined by the UCI with details provided to Team Managers.

Due to the limited space in the team area, only riders who have a competition or practice that day will be permitted to enter the team area with their bike. **Please make your riders aware of this.** Bikes are not permitted in the spectator area.

13.2 TEAM TENT BOOKING – CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Team Pits will feature a series of 12m x 4m tent structures. Teams can request a FULL TENT (48m²) or a HALF TENT (24m²). Team Tents will include power, Wi-Fi, tables, and chairs. The price for a FULL TENT is AUD \$2700 and a HALF TENT AUD \$1400. Teams may book more than one tent for their use.

There are **NO FREE** tents available to National teams during the Championships category practice and competition at the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships. **ALL** national federations must book and pay for a tent with the Organisers

14. NUMBER PLATES

6.1.091 Each bicycle entered into competition must have a number plate attached to the front of the handlebars. Number plates must be made of plastic or other similar flexible material. Riders must use the plate and number colour combinations specified for the category in which they are Racing as follows:

a. Championships level

- i. Men Elite, Women Elite: white plate, black numbers.
- ii. Men Under 23, Women Under 23: grey plate, white numbers.
- iii. Men Juniors, Women Juniors: black plate, white numbers.

b. Challenge level / Masters level

- i. Boys, Men, Masters Men: yellow plate, black numbers
- ii. Girls, Women, Masters Women: blue plate, white numbers
- iii. Cruiser: red plate, white numbers.

6.1.092 If a photo finish system is utilised, each bicycle entered into competition must display a lateral number plate/sticker located just behind the steer tube, if one is required within the technical guide. The digits shall be black placed on white background, or white placed on a black background.

During the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships, Challenge and Masters all riders must display a lateral number plate located just behind the steer tube. The UCI will provide a lateral plate for each rider as part of their Rider Pack.

In all UCI sanctioned BMX Racing events a rider must display the number assigned to him according to the rules set forth in § 6. A rider who fails to display the correct number will not be scored.

6.1.093 In all UCI sanctioned BMX Racing events a rider must display the number assigned to him in accordance with all relevant provisions of these regulations, including those concerning the UCI International Elite Number System, if applicable. A rider who fails to display the correct number will be refused their start, or relegated, if it is noticed after beginning a heat or run.

The area of the plate that provides a background for the number must, during the entire duration of a competition, be kept free of markings, stickers or other impediments to the number's legibility. Riders may not cut, mutilate, remove or put additional stickers or markings on their number plate.

Handlebar plates and lateral plates must be on every rider's bicycle before practice.

15. RACE EQUIPMENT AND CLOTHING

6.1.079 Crank arms may be of any length so long as they do not compromise the bicycle's ground clearance.

The bottom bracket bearings must be adjusted so as to allow the cranks to spin smoothly and without noticeable play.

Pedals must be securely attached to the crank arms. Toe clips and straps are not permitted.

Forms of connecting the riders' shoe to the pedal via Interlocking pedal-cleat systems (e.g. magnetic pedals) are allowed for all riders aged 13 and older. For avoidance of doubt, riders aged 12 and under must use flat pedals with no forms of connection to the pedal permitted.

6.1.081 Helmets must be of full face construction and must be equipped with a visor that has a minimum length of 10 cm. Open face helmets are not allowed. In accordance with article 1.3.002, neither the helmet nor its visor may be modified.

Helmets must be worn with the straps securely fastened whenever a rider is practicing or racing or is otherwise within the track boundaries.

When racing, from the start of a heat or run until the point in time when a rider completes the heat or run by crossing the finish line, if a rider's helmet is removed for any reason, that rider shall be considered as having abandoned the heat or run in question and will be scored as Did Not Finish (DNF).

The UCI strongly recommends that riders wear the following protection:

- a. Back, elbow, knee and shoulder protectors made of rigid materials
- b. Protection of the cervical vertebrae.

6.1.087 Any added aerodynamic accessories on personal equipment are not permitted.

6.1.088 Cameras are not permitted during practice and competition.

The UCI can decide to allow a camera during practice and competition but only for the usage of the TV production company. The rider is responsible for securing the fixation of the cameras on the bike or on the visor/peak of the helmet in order to avoid any danger. Metal / permanent fixtures to attach the cameras are not allowed, tape and velcro are allowed.

Cameras (as described above) may only be used by riders in the Championships level categories.
(text modified on 01.01.25)

Note: The practical implementation of this rule means that on-board video cameras will only be accepted if they are attached to the helmet visor or the bicycle (in a way that does not present a safety risk). Cameras must not be directly attached to the helmet itself. Such cameras can only be used once the waiver valid for the 2026 season has been signed by the riders.

6.1.097 Each rider that has received a UCI International Elite number and also the riders that choose to ride with a world number 1-8, may choose to print their number on the back of their jersey according to the specifications explained in article 6.1.097. Doing so is not mandatory. (article abridged)

The Schedule is subject to change due to rider entry numbers, event format, weather and other unforeseen situations that may arise.

No refunds of entry fees, nor any form of compensation will be made in case of any delay, schedule change, change of the race format, cancellation, error or omission.

18. DELAYS

Teams are advised that the weather may require a delay in certain cases, as may any other unforeseen circumstance or force majeure. It is possible that significant delays in the practice or racing program may be experienced. The UCI will follow the instructions of civil authorities concerning any such delays.

In case of a delay, the procedure used to inform the teams of delays and amendments to the schedule, will be discussed during the team managers' meeting.

18.1 CHALLENGE AND MASTERS CATEGORIES

During Practice:

- Should a delay happen during practice, if possible, extra practice time may be given to those countries that experienced the delay. However, depending on the situation, it may not be possible to extend or replace any shortened or cancelled practice. In such case, the UCI's decision shall be final and cannot be appealed.

During Racing:

- Should a significant delay happen during racing on any of the challenge or masters category racing days, it may not be possible to finish the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Challenge for those categories, depending upon the length of the delay.
- The competition for each challenge and masters category will take place on the day that it is scheduled to occur without any postponement. In case of any cancellation, the competition for the affected categories will not be completed, and the results will be determined based upon the racing that has been completed for each such category.
- Should a significant delay occur, depending upon the UCI Technical Delegate's judgment, the UCI may decide to stop the event for the concerned categories. In this case, the results will be decided in accordance with article 6.1.041 for each category, based upon the racing that has been completed for each such category. Should this happen, any ties that prevent a clear determination of the top 8 riders within each affected category will be broken using the special derogation found earlier in this competition guide. The UCI's decision to stop the event for the concerned categories shall be final and cannot be appealed.

18.2 CHAMPIONSHIPS CATEGORIES

During Practice:

- Should a delay happen during practice, if possible, extra practice may be given to those categories that experienced the delay. However, depending on the situation, it may not be possible to extend or replace any shortened or cancelled practice. In such case, the UCI's decision shall be final and cannot be appealed.

During Racing:

- Should a significant delay happen during racing, it may not be possible to finish the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships, depending upon the length of the delay.
- The competition for the championships category will take place on the day that it is scheduled to occur, without any postponement. In case of any cancellation, the competition for the affected categories will not be completed, and the results will be determined based upon the racing that has been completed for each such category.

- Should this occur, depending upon the amount of racing remaining at 14h00 local time, or in the UCI Technical Delegate's judgment, until the level of available daylight is no longer acceptable, the UCI may decide to stop the event for the concerned categories. In this case, the results will be decided in accordance with article 6.1.041 for each category, based upon the racing that has been completed. The UCI's decision to stop the event for the concerned categories shall be final and cannot be appealed.

19. OFFICIAL CEREMONIES AND AWARDS

19.1 OFFICIAL OPENING CEREMONY

The Opening Ceremony for the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships will be conducted on Saturday 18 July after practice concludes and before the qualifications commence. The Opening Ceremony will include:

- The UCI Anthem & UCI Flag raising
- Official speeches from the UCI and LOC, and
- An indigenous Welcome to Country including a Smoking Ceremony & Didgeridoo

19.2 OFFICIAL CEREMONIES – CHAMPIONSHIPS CATEGORIES

- 9.1.044** Within 10 minutes following the end of each speciality (unless otherwise provided and duly recorded in an official communiqué), the World Champion, as well as the second and the third placed riders shall be ready for the official ceremony that shall be conducted under the responsibility of the President of the Commissaires' Panel.
- 9.1.046** Riders shall appear in racing attire, wearing their national jerseys but bare-headed and without headband or glasses, until they leave the official ceremony enclosure.
- 9.1.050** A World Champion may not wear the jersey identifying his title and bearing the regulation advertisement of his main sponsor(s) until, at earliest, the day following that on which he received it.
- 9.1.051** Any infringement of the provisions of articles 9.1.044 to 9.1.050 above shall be punished by a fine of CHF 2,000 to CHF 10,000 minimum. A higher fine may be imposed depending on the advantage derived from the offence.

19.3 UCI WORLD CHAMPION JERSEY AND MEDALS

The UCI World Champion for each Championships category will receive a UCI World Champion Jersey.

The top 3 riders in each Championships category will be awarded a 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships medal and a trophy.

19.4 UCI WORLD MASTERS CHAMPION JERSEY AND MEDALS

The UCI Masters World Champion for each Masters category will receive a UCI Masters World Champion Jersey.

The top 3 riders in each Masters category will be awarded a 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Masters medal and a trophy.

19.5 UCI BMX RACING WORLD CHALLENGE TROPHIES

The top 8 riders in Challenge will be awarded a trophy.

20. PRIZE SCALES

To follow the same procedure as in other UCI cycling disciplines, the prize money won by riders in the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships will be transferred to each rider's national federation.

Each rider can thereafter collect the prize money through his/her national federation.

Note that the UCI will make the payment after the results of the anti-doping tests have been confirmed.

21. MEDICAL INFORMATION

21.1 MEDICAL SERVICE

A comprehensive medical service will be available at the venue on all official training/practice and race days. The medical centre, staffed by doctors, nurses, paramedics, physiotherapists, and first responders, will be situated between the finish area and the staging tents. It will be accessible for assessing and treating riders and team staff who are injured or unwell. There is no charge to visit the medical centre.

The medical centre will open 60 minutes before the first scheduled session each day, whether practice or competition, and will close 60 minutes after the final scheduled session, whether practice or competition.

21.2 MEDICAL AND TRAVEL INSURANCE

Each rider and team staff member is responsible for ensuring they have appropriate travel and medical insurance coverage for any accidents, illnesses, or injuries that may occur while travelling to and attending the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships, Challenge, and Masters.

Australia has reciprocal health care agreements with Belgium, Finland, Italy, Malta, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, the Republic of Ireland, Slovenia, Sweden, and the United Kingdom. These arrangements enable eligible visitors (citizens from these countries) to access medically necessary treatment within the Australian public health system.

However, reciprocal health care arrangements are not a replacement for travel and health insurance. Riders and team members should still purchase their own insurance coverage. Reciprocal arrangements typically cover only public hospital treatments and do not eliminate the need for comprehensive insurance, including coverage for private hospital care, ambulance services, medical evacuation, repatriation, follow-up treatment, or other related expenses.

21.3 REFERRAL PATHWAYS

Riders and team staff, whether competing or not, are encouraged to report to the medical centre if they are injured or unwell, rather than going directly to the hospital initially. The event medical team has comprehensive capabilities on-site and has created several referral pathways to help streamline care, and may be able to facilitate more efficient assessment, investigation, treatment, and onward referral where appropriate.

These pathways may include specialist radiology referral pathways, sports medicine and sports physician referral pathways, orthopaedic referral pathways, direct access arrangements, pathology referrals, and prescriptions when clinically indicated.

21.4 CONCUSSION

The 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships, Challenge and Masters will adhere to the UCI cycling-specific concussion protocol. Any rider suspected of having a concussion will be immediately removed from training or competition and assessed by the event medical team. Initial screening on the track or in the park will look for red flags and observable signs and symptoms; where necessary, the rider will be transferred to the medical centre for further evaluation. This may include an SCAT5 assessment conducted by a registered healthcare professional in a controlled environment, with repeat assessments as clinically indicated. Any rider diagnosed with a concussion or suspected concussion will not return to competition or be able to practice at any time., All medically confirmed concussions will be managed and reported in line with UCI requirements. The Chief Medical Officer will have the final decision on all medical matters, including removing a rider from the competition.

21.5 HOSPITAL TRANSFERS

Ambulances will be available on-site to transfer athletes who, in the opinion of the Chief Medical Officer, have sustained injuries requiring ambulance transport to the hospital.

For other situations where ambulance transport is not considered necessary, teams will be required to transfer athletes to the hospital or other medical services in their own vehicles.

Challenge riders with wristbands will have access to the spectator area (not grandstands) during Challenge practice and all Challenge and Masters competitions. Challenge riders wishing to watch the Championships racing, will be required to purchase a spectator ticket.

Championships riders with accreditation badges will have access to the venue (not grandstands) during the Challenge and Championships practice and race days, only when wearing their Rider accreditation, or by purchasing a ticket.

24. TRAINING SESSION BOOKINGS

24.1 PRE EVENT TRAINING BOOKING – CHAMPIONSHIPS ONLY

Pre Event training for Championships riders will be available for riders. The Pre Event training does not form part of the 2026 UCI BMX Racing World Championships and is arranged and managed by the Organising Committee. The UCI takes no responsibility for the booking, scheduling or running of these training sessions.

The following terms are provided by the Organising Committee in regard to the Pre Event training:

1. Track time may only be booked by National Federations competing in the Championships categories.
2. A National Federation may book a maximum of 3 sessions across the period.
3. All sessions are limited to 100 riders each session.
4. National Federation sessions cost AUD\$50 per rider for 90 minutes with proof of General Liability Insurance of no less than €2,000,000; each occurrence/damage to athletes or rented premises.
5. Teams will be invoiced by Aus Cycling upon confirmation of the booking. Payment must be made by bank wire transfer (SWIFT bank transfer payment) prior to the training sessions or via credit card on the day of the training. Any unpaid training session bookings (used or unused) will be charged to the National Federation and must be paid before Rider packs will be issued.
6. It is the responsibility of each rider to have the correct medical insurance coverage in place for any accident or injury that may occur while attending the Brisbane SX International BMX Centre.
7. All users must show their National Federation Cycling Licence before obtaining Track access.
8. Medical and First Aid during Championship training sessions will be provided by the Organiser; however, rider care remains the responsibility of Teams.
9. Vehicle and Rider access to the track will be different to event time. Parking and access routes will be advised prior to the training sessions to the contact email provided during the booking of the training sessions.

On site requests (requests that are made after the on-line accreditation is closed) will be limited in number and subject to evaluation on a case-by-case basis. Approval of such late requests cannot be guaranteed even if quota mentioned below has not yet been reached. We strongly recommend that accreditation requests are made using the on-line system.

Team staff (including team managers) working for both Challenge and Championships categories should only be registered as Championships staff; the badge they receive will be valid during Challenge, Masters and Championships competitions.
